

Converting grades from certificates into qualification points in the admission procedure to first cycle programmes with instruction in Polish

1. Scores for persons holders of the New Maturity Certificate.
 - 1) A candidate who has obtained a maturity certificate by passing the New Maturity Exam shall be qualified based on results in the written part of the maturity exam – in subjects specified in § 15.a items 1-3, taken at an advanced level and in the second foreign language (§ 15.a item 4) taken at an ordinary or advanced level.
 - 2) Maturity exam results in the subjects stipulated in § 15.a items 1, 2 and 3 shall be converted pursuant to the rule: one percentage point equals one qualification point, subject to point 4.
 - 3) Maturity exam results in the subjects stipulated in § 15.a item 4 shall be converted based on the rule: $\frac{1}{3}$ (one-third) of a qualification point shall be awarded for one percentage point, subject to point 4.
 - 4) A candidate who has passed a maturity exam in a foreign language stipulated in § 15.a item 3 at the level of bilingual classes shall be awarded $\frac{4}{3}$ (four-thirds) of a qualification point for one percentage point obtained in the maturity exam, not more than 100 qualification points, and in the case of the second foreign language passed at the level of bilingual classes candidates shall be awarded $\frac{4}{9}$ (four-ninths) of a qualification point for each percentage point received in the maturity exam, not more than $33\frac{1}{3}$ (thirty three and one-third) qualification points.
 - 5) A candidate who has passed a maturity exam in the subject stipulated in § 15.a items 1 and 2 at the level of bilingual classes shall be additionally awarded $\frac{1}{3}$ (one-third) of a qualification point for one percentage point.
2. Scores for persons holders of the Old Maturity Certificate.
 - 1) A candidate who has obtained a maturity certificate by passing the old maturity exam shall be qualified based on the sum of values of the grades obtained in the spoken or written part of the maturity exam in the subjects stipulated in § 15.a items 1-3 and $\frac{1}{3}$ (one-third) of the value of the grade in the second foreign language (§ 15.a item 4)

obtained in the spoken or written part of the maturity exam, with the proviso that if the candidate has received a grade in both the spoken and the written part of the maturity exam in any of the subjects mentioned above, only the higher grade shall be recognised and used for conversion.

2) A candidate who in his/her maturity exam was exempted from taking an exam in any of the subjects stipulated in § 15.a items 1, 2 or 3, shall receive a number of qualification points equivalent to the value of a maximum grade in the subject of exemption. If the subject of exemption is the second foreign language (§ 15.a item 4), the candidate shall be awarded the number of qualification points equivalent to 1/3 (one-third) of the value of a maximum grade.

3) The sum of values of grades from the maturity certificate, as stipulated in section 1, shall be converted into qualification points by multiplying them by $16\frac{2}{3}$ (sixteen and two-thirds).

3. Scores for persons with International Baccalaureate.

1) Candidates holders of International Baccalaureate shall be qualified based on the grades in their IB diploma in the subjects stipulated in § 15.a items 1-4 taken at a standard level (SL) or higher level (HL) - subject to point 3, and the score in the entrepreneurship knowledge test conducted by the University Admission Board for Foreigners and aimed at assessing candidates' general intellectual capabilities for studying economic sciences.

2) Grades received in the subjects stipulated in § 15.a items 1 and 2 shall be converted into qualification points pursuant to the table:

- 3) Grades obtained in the subjects stipulated in § 15.a items 3 and 4 shall be converted into qualification points pursuant to the table, and the number of qualification points awarded for the second foreign language (§ 15.a item 4) shall be divided by 3 (three):

4. Scores for persons with other maturity certificates.

- 1) Candidates who have obtained an EB diploma by passing the European Baccalaureate or are holders of other maturity certificates received abroad, shall be qualified based on the grades in their EB diploma or another foreign maturity certificate.
- 2) Grades in particular subjects stipulated in § 15.a items 1-3 expressed on a percent scale shall be treated as qualification points, i.e. pursuant to the rule that one percentage point equals one qualification point. For each percentage point of the grade in the second foreign language (§ 15.a item 4) a candidate shall be awarded 1/3 (one-third) of a qualification point.
- 3) If grades in an EB diploma or another foreign maturity certificate are not expressed in percent but as points, the University Admission Board for Foreigners shall convert the point grade scale into the percentage scale and then shall qualify candidates pursuant to point 2.
- 4) Should an EB diploma or another foreign maturity certificate present only a general exam result, the candidate shall be qualified based on this result and shall receive the number of qualification points calculated using the rule stipulated in point 2 or point 3, but only if this candidate covered a minimum of two years of tuition in mathematics or physics in his/her secondary school. Should the condition from the aforementioned sentence be not met, the candidate shall not be awarded any points in the qualification procedure.
